YOUTH HORSE SHOW DEPARTMENT RULES

- 1. Pre-Entries must be entered online at the Fair's website <u>www.venturacountyfair.org</u> before June 24, 2022.
- 2. A Veterinarian's certificate for the horse, or a doctor's note for the rider, must accompany a cancellation to be eligible for a 50% refund. No refunds after 5 PM, Thursday, July 14, 2022.
- 3. Open to Age 19. Age as of January 1, 2022.
- 4. Rider Ability Groups:

Walk/Trot: For riders that are not comfortable at the canter or lope. Will only compete at the Walk and Trot. Ages 9 to 19.

<u>Maiden</u>: 1st or 2nd year showing, any age. Previous Show experience with other livestock, small or large, is not considered. Only Horse Show experience.

Novice Rider: Riders with less than 4 years Show experience.

Green Horse: Horses that are in their 1st or 2nd year of showing. Any age.

<u>Intermediate</u>: Open to all horse and rider combination, of all ages, with some Show experience and comfortable with class requirements.

- <u>Advanced</u>: Open to all horse and rider combinations, of all ages, with Show experience and comfortable with class requirements.
- 5. Show Management reserves the right to limit entries at its discretion. Classes may be split or combined, depending on the number of entries.
- 6. **NO DOGS PERMITTED** anywhere on the Fairgrounds during Horse Fair, except those permitted by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
- 7. Only Horses competing in Open Youth Horse Show may be stalled. No other livestock allowed in stalls.
- 8. Exhibitor must provide own bedding. **No bedding is provided** and is not available on the Fairgrounds.
- Stalls will be available at 12:00 PM on Thursday, July 14, 2022. Please call and make an appointment with the Show Secretary for early entrance for Campers, RVs, and Living Quarter Horse Trailers.
- 10. On Sunday, July 17, 2022, vehicles, and trailers are <u>not</u> allowed in the barn aisles until close of Show or Show Manager's approval.
- 11. The barn area must be kept clean, and all tack must be properly stored at all times. All stalls must be always kept as a Fair Exhibit. All stalls must be cleaned out at the conclusion of the Show. Shavings must be put in the middle of the aisle. All trash must be put in a proper receptacle. A \$25.00 cleaning deposit will be returned if the stall is cleaned and stripped.
- 12. Wash racks may be used for sponge bathing or to quickly rinse horses off. Limited water uses ONLY.
- 13. Horses must be fit and in Show condition. Show Management reserves the right to dismiss any horse that seems unfit or at risk of injury. Horses that are unsound will be disqualified. Show Management decision is final.
- 14. Horses must be in appropriate saddlery and equipment for the Class entered. For example, Western Classes and Trail require Western tack, English Classes require English tack, **Gymkhana** riders can ride either English or Western but must be ALL English or ALL Western.
- 15. Horses under 5 years old may be ridden in a standard hackamore or snaffle bit in Western Classes. Mechanical hackamores are allowed in Gymkhana if riding Western, but not in Western or English Classes.
- 16. Stallions (uncastrated male, over 1 year old) may not be shown.
- 17. **NO HUNT COATS, WESTERN SHOW CLOTHES OR CHAPS.** The dress code requirements in the USEF and CGA rulebooks are suspended. All Exhibitors must wear beige or tan breeches for English, and black or blue jeans/pants for Western. Both English and Western must wear a white collared shirt (long or short sleeve).
- 18. 4-H Exhibitors must wear their 4-H scarf and Grange must wear their vest. Consult project leaders regarding appropriate attire.
- 19. All Exhibitors must wear a properly fitted equestrian helmet that meets ASTM/SEI approval with secured chin harness at all times when mounted on a horse.
- 20. The USEF rulebook applies to all Classes in the Western and English Divisions.
- 21. The CGA rulebook applies to the Gymkhana Division.
- 22. Exhibitors' numbers will be assigned during registration; Exhibitors must keep those numbers throughout the weekend and make them visible while riding.
- 23. High Point Award will be given to Horse and Rider Combination only. Showmanship participation is required for Overall High Point. This Horse and Rider Combination will be the Horse and Rider

- Combination eligible for Overall High Point consideration (Division 675). Championship Classes DO NOT count towards High Point.
- 24. Daily High Point awards will be given, so an Exhibitor may decide to ride one horse for English, another for Western, and/or another horse for Gymkhana.
- 25. High Point Awards will be based on the following point system:

 1st: 10 2nd: 9 3rd: 8 4th: 7 5th: 6 6th: 5 7th: 4 8th: 3 9th: 2 10th: 1 point
- 26. In Class listings, Classes counting toward a High Point calculation are designated with an asterisk.
- 27. The warm-up ring can be used before and after the Show with the Show Manager in attendance if there is one (1) Parent/Leader/Trainer for every four (4) riders.
- 28. Lunging will be allowed before 7:00 AM in the warm-up arena and designated lunging area. The designated lunging area will be marked and available throughout the weekend. 15-minute time limit applies.
- 29. Trainers are not allowed to do schooling rides on any horses. Youth riders are allowed to school for others if the situation is safe for all involved.
- 30. All 4-H/Grange Exhibitors must own or lease the horse she/he rides and must be under the rider's care and management for at least 120 days prior to July 15, 2022. Exhibitor must have proof of ownership or lease, along with identifying papers. These papers must be on file with 4-H EPDC Chair and/or the Grange Association by March 15, 2022. Each Rider may identify more than one horse to have a back-up mount available.
- 31. There will be NO COACHING from the rail during Classes. Coaching includes verbal and non-verbal commands, instructions, gestures, etc. Adults may coach in the warm-up arena. After the second offense Exhibitor will be disqualified from the Show.
- 32. Parents must refrain from communicating with the Judge. Please contact the Office if you have a question for the Judge.
- 33. Please go to the Show Organizer or Secretary with any complaints or concerns. 4-H, Grange, and Pony Club, please follow the chain of command in your group and then proceed to the Office. Decisions from the Ground Jury (made up of the Judge, Show Manager and Show Secretary) are final.
- 34. The Club Leaders must remain on grounds after the Show on Sunday until all their members have loaded their horses and to make sure no members are left at the Fairgrounds.

DIVISION 677 – ENGLISH FRIDAY, JULY 15, 2022 7:30 AM Warm Up Class Opens - Show Starts at 8:00 AM

Warm Up Over Fences: Course will be the same as the Hunter Course and will be judged. Simple changes will not be penalized for Maiden, Green Horse and Novice Rider.

Trot Cross-rails: To be judged as Equitation or Hunters as designated but Exhibitors will not be penalized for trotting the course or performing lead changes through the trot. Riders may trot or canter at their discretion. Riders that compete in Trot Cross-rail Classes may not compete in any other Over Fences Classes.

Equitation Over Fences: Shall be judged over a course of at least 8 fences with two changes of direction. Rider will be judged from the time that they enter the arena. Emphasis is placed on the rider's ability to control and guide their horse over the course while maintaining the correct posture.

Hunter Over Fences: Judged on the horse's performance over a course of 8 fences with 2 changes of direction. Exhibitors are judged on the ability to maintain an even pace and negotiate the jumps in a graceful manner with knock downs and refusals being penalized. Simple changes will not be penalized for Maiden, Green Horse and Novice Rider.

Hunter Hack: Riders will be asked to demonstrate their ability on the rail by riding at the walk, trot, and canter in both directions. Riders will then be asked to individually jump over two fences and follow any directions from the Judge. This Class is judged 70% on jumping style and ability, and 30% on the rail work.

Jumpers (Table 2b): This Class will test the Exhibitor's ability to clear a course of fences without jumping faults for knock downs, refusals, or getting off course. If the Exhibitor completes the course without any penalties, they will without leaving the arena, proceed to the Jump Off. Upon being given a signal of a bell or whistle from the Judge, they will ride over a shortened course where the lowest penalty points and fastest time will win.

Equitation Over Fences Medal Class: This is a special Equitation Over Fences Class in which Exhibitors will ride over a course of fences, being judged on their position and ability to control the horse. This course may have additional tests worked into the course or they may have a "Work Off" which may consist of a shortened course or demonstrate certain abilities or movements on the flat. This course and any work off are determined by the Judge and may include trot fences, halting at a particular marker, rein-back, figure eight at the trot or canter, simple changes of lead, gallop, extended trot, turn on the haunches, and/or work without stirrups.

English Equitation: Judged on rider's position at the halt and while in motion. The rider shall have a neat and workmanlike appearance, displaying the correct position and have a light seat and hands, showing suppleness and conveying the impression of complete control. Riders will be asked to show their horse at the walk, trot and canter in both directions and may be asked to halt, rein-back. Advanced and Intermediate may be asked to ride without stirrups (at the Judge's discretion). **Walk/Trot Classes** will not be asked to canter or ride without stirrups. **English Pleasure:** Riders will compete in a group at the walk, trot and canter and may be asked to halt and reinback. Exhibitors are judged on the horse maintaining a steady, comfortable pace at all gaits giving the appearance of being a pleasure to ride. **Walk/Trot Classes** will not be asked to canter.

English Horsemanship: Individual Exhibitors will ride a simple predetermined pattern that will be judged in their ability to control and manage their horse. These patterns may include walk, trot, and canter in one or both directions, halt, rein-back, counter canter, sitting trot, extended trot. **Walk/Trot Classes** will not be asked to canter or ride without stirrups. **Advanced** may be asked to mount and dismount.

DIVISION 675 – SHOWMANSHIP SATURDAY, JULY 16, 2022

Showmanship starts at 8:00 AM

Showmanship: This Class evaluates the Exhibitor's ability to present their horse in hand. They will be asked to lead their horse and perform a pattern to show control and presentation of themselves and their horse. Exhibitors may compete in either English or Western. English must present in a bridle and Western in a halter, with Exhibitor in respective English or Western attire (4-H or Grange attire if member). Exhibitors will be judged:

10% on Exhibitor Presentation

30% Fitting and Grooming of Horse (Condition, grooming and/or clipping and cleanliness)

60% Showmanship (Moving or leading, posing show animal to best advantage, poise, alertness, and attitude of Exhibitor)

DIVISION 676 – WESTERN SATURDAY, JULY 16, 2022 Western will start around10:00 AM

Western Equitation: Judged on the rider's position at the halt and while in motion. The rider shall have a neat and workmanlike appearance, displaying the correct position and have a light seat and hands, showing suppleness and conveying the impression of complete control. Riders will be asked to show their horses as the walk, jog and lope in both directions and may be asked to halt, rein-back. Advanced and Intermediate may be asked to or ride without stirrups at the Judge's discretion. **Walk/Trot Classes** will not be asked to lope or ride without stirrups.

Western Pleasure: Riders will compete in a group at the walk, jog and lope and may be asked to halt and rein-back. Exhibitors are judged on the horse maintaining a steady, comfortable pace at all gaits giving the appearance of being a pleasure to ride. **Walk/Trot Classes** will not be asked to lope.

Western Horsemanship: Individual Exhibitors will ride a simple pre-determined pattern that will be judged on their ability to control and manage their horse. These patterns may include walk, jog, and lope in one or both directions, halt, rein-back, side pass, extended jog. **Walk/Trot Classes** will not be asked to lope. **Advanced** may be asked to mount and dismount.

Trail: Exhibitors will be asked to perform a course of 6 to 8 obstacles while at the walk, jog, or lope. These obstacles may include a gate, bridge, walk overs, jog overs, side pass, back through, serpentine, mailbox, turn on the forehand, turn on the haunches, a box, and riding to specific markers. **Walk/Trot** will not be required to lope or do lope overs.

Obedience: Exhibitors will be asked to perform various challenges at the request of the Judge to show the horse's obedience to the rider. This may include walk, jog, lope, extended jog, extended lope, halt, rein-back, turn on the haunches or turn on the forehand.

Warm Up Trail: THIS CLASS IS NOT JUDGED. \$5.00 per round (limit 3 rounds). Must be paid before entering the ring. Riders may only work each obstacle once during each round.

Attire: Riders may ride English or Western but must be ALL English or ALL Western. Helmets that are ASTM/SEI approved and secured under the chin are always required when mounted.
